The mission of the Texas Board of Nursing is to protect and promote the welfare of the people of Texas by ensuring that each person holding a license as a nurse in the State of Texas is competent to practice safely. The Board fulfills its mission through the regulation of the practice of nursing and the approval of nursing education programs. This mission, derived from the Nursing Practice Act, supersedes the interest of any individual, the nursing profession, or any special interest group.



Texas Board of Nursing, Texas Medical Board, and Texas State Board of Pharmacy Issue Joint Statement on Hydrocodone Combination Products and Tramadol

The Texas Board of Nursing, Texas Medical Board and Texas State Board of Pharmacy advise their respective licensees that the United States Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) published a final rule reclassifying hydrocodone combination products (HCPs) as Schedule II controlled substances. The reclassification becomes effective on October 6, 2014. HCPs include products such as Lortab®, Vicodin®, and Norco®.

All providers who order, dispense, or prescribe HCPs in the state of Texas must comply with requirements for prescribing Schedule II medications as set forth in state and federal law beginning on October 6, 2014. Advanced practice registered nurses and physician assistants may only prescribe hydrocodone combination products when providing care to hospice patients or practicing in hospital facility based practices as provided for in Chapter 157.0511(b-1) of the *Texas Occupations Code* and if registered with DEA and the Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS) to prescribe Schedule II controlled substances.

It is important for all prescribers, pharmacists, and pharmacy staff to be aware that prescriptions *written* for HCPs on or after October 6, 2014, must be written on a DPS official prescription form and no refills may be authorized. Any prescriptions for HCPs that are

dispensed before October 6, 2014, that have additional refills authorized may be dispensed in accordance with state and federal law. The allowance to dispense these refills expires on April 8, 2015.

The Boards of Nursing, Medicine and Pharmacy also remind their respective licensees that the DEA classified tramadol as a Schedule IV controlled substance. This change became effective on August 18, 2014. All prescribers and pharmacy personnel must comply with requirements for ordering, prescribing and handling Schedule IV medications as set forth in state and federal law.

Advisory Committee Updates

Delegation Task Force for Chapter 224

During the July 2014 Board Meeting, new Delegation Task Force Members for Chapter 224, Delegation of Nursing Tasks by Registered Professional Nurses to Unlicensed Personnel for Clients with Acute Conditions or in Acute Care Environments were approved. They are Monte Chambers RN representing Texas School for the Blind and Visually Impaired; Ramona Gaston-McNutt RN BSN representing Texas Department of Aging and Disability Services' Prescribed Pediatric Extended Care Centers; and Gary Eubanks RN MSN representing University of Texas Medical Branch Correctional Managed Care.

The Delegation Task Force (DTF) for Chapter 224 met on July 30th and September 5, 2014, to discuss proposed revisions to the rules. For more information, visit the Board's website and click on News, then Ad Hoc Meetings.

Eligibility and Disciplinary Advisory Committee

The Board of Nursing's Eligibility and Disciplinary Advisory Committee met on August 1, 2014 to discuss the Board's Guidelines for Physical and Psychological Evaluations. Psychologist John Lehman, Ph.D., presented the recent changes to the Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders V (DSM-V) and served as a resource witness during the committee's discussion. Psychologist Stephen Thorne, Ph.D. also served as a resource witness. The Committee discussed amending the Board's guidelines to ensure that physical and psychological evaluations are consistent among evaluators and contain all relevant and necessary information for the Board to make informed decisions. The Advisory Committee will reconvene on Monday, December 1, 2014, to review specific changes to the Board's Guidelines, Disciplinary Sanction Policies, and Rules 213.27, 213.28, 213.29, and 213.33.

Nursing Practice Advisory Committee

During the July 2014 Board Meeting, amendments to Chapter 216, Continuing Competency, were adopted and included revisions to Board Rule §216.1, Continuing Competency Definitions; §216.5, Additional Criteria for Specific Continuing Education Programs and §216.6, Activities that are not Acceptable as Continuing Education. These revisions expanded the definition and criteria for authorship, program development and presentation of a Continuing Nursing Education program.

In addition, the Board approved a charge for the Nursing Practice Advisory Committee (NPAC) to review and make recommendations regarding Board Rule 217.16, Minor Incidents. Also, approved were two new NPAC members: Donna Richardson RN, DNP representing the Texas Nurses Association and Michelle Dionne-Vahalik, RN, MSN representing the Department of Aging and Disability Services.

Task Force to Study Implications of Growth of Nursing Education Programs in Texas

The Task Force to Study Implications of Growth of Nursing Education Programs in Texas met on June 13, 2014 to address charges to develop a guideline for optimal clinical instruction and to provide an analysis of findings from the 2013 Nursing Education Program Information Survey (NEPIS) related to required clinical hours in prelicensure nursing education programs. Task Force members provided input and recommended the continued development of the guideline using a review of current literature, results of a survey sent to faculty, students and clinical partners, and findings from the NCSBN National Simulation Study. An analysis of the 2013 NEPIS related to required clinical hours will be included in the education guideline. The Task Force also recommended a statewide faculty workshop related to optimal clinical instruction be planned in spring 2015.

Summary of Actions

A regular meeting of the Board of Nursing was held July 17-18, 2014, in Austin.
The following is a summary of Board actions taken during this meeting.



In the July 25, 2014, issue of the *Texas Register*, the Texas Board of Nursing published as adopted amendments to 22 Tex. Admin. Code §213.32, pertaining to *Corrective Action Proceedings and Schedule of Administrative Fines*. The amendments are adopted under the authority of the Occupations Code Subchapter N and §301.151, as well as the general authority of Senate Bill (SB) 1415, enacted by the 81st Legislature, Regular Session, effective September 1, 2009, and SB 1058, enacted by the 83rd Legislature, Regular Session, effective September 1, 2013, and are necessary to specify additional types of violations for which a corrective action may be imposed.

The Board also adopted amendments to 22 Tex. Admin. Code §213.34, pertaining to *Deferred Disciplinary Action Pilot Program*. The amendments to 22 Tex. Admin. Code §213.34 are necessary for consistency with the newly enacted legislation and to implement deferred discipline as a permanent disciplinary option under the Board's rules.

New 22 Tex. Admin. Code 213.35, pertaining to *Knowledge, Skills, Training, Assessment and Research (KSTAR) Pilot Program* was also adopted. The new section effectuates a two-year pilot program designed to evaluate the use of individualized competency assessments and targeted remediation plans as a form of disciplinary action for nursing practice violations of the Nursing Practice Act (NPA). The amendments to 22 Tex. Admin. Code §213.32, §213.34, and

213.35 became effective on July 30, 2014.

In the August 1, 2014, issue of the *Texas Register*, the Texas Board of Nursing withdrew the proposed repeal of new Chapter 221, relating to *Advanced Practice Nurses*, and proposed new Chapter 221, relating to *Advanced Practice Registered Nurses*.

In the August 8, 2014, issue of the *Texas Register*, the Texas Board of Nursing published as adopted amendments to 22 Tex. Admin. Code §214.9, pertaining to *Program of Study*. Amendments to 22 Tex. Admin. Code §214.9 are necessary to clarify two of the existing provisions of the section. The Board also published as adopted amendments to 22 Tex. Admin. Code §215.9, pertaining to *Program of Study*. The amendments are necessary to clarify the existing provisions of the section and to address potential changes in nursing program curriculum as a result of SB 215, enacted by the 83rd Legislature, Regular Session, effective September 1, 2013, and SB 497, enacted by the 83rd Legislature, Regular Session, effective June 14, 2013. Amendments to 22 Tex. Admin. Code §214.9 and 215.9 became effective on August 10, 2014.

The Board also proposed amendments to 22 Tex. Admin. Code §215.5, pertaining to *Philosophy/Mission and Objectives/Outcomes*. The amendment is necessary to correct a typographical error in the title of the Differentiated Essential Competencies of Graduates of Texas Nursing Programs (DECs). Amendments were also proposed to 22 Tex. Admin. Code §217.1, pertaining to *Definitions*. The amendments are necessary to eliminate obsolete provisions

from the rule, to update references to the "Texas Board of Nursing", and for consistency with the updated provisions of the NPA. Amendments were also proposed to 22 Tex. Admin. Code §223.1, pertaining to *Fees*. The amendments were proposed under the authority of the Occupations Code §301.151 and §301.155 and eliminate unnecessary and obsolete provisions from the rule text. No comments were received to proposed 22 Tex. Admin. Code §215.5, §217.1, and 223.1 and the BON published as adopted amended 22 Tex. Admin. Code §215.5, §217.1, and 223.1 in the September 26, 2014, issue of the *Texas Register*, effective September 28, 2014.

In the September 19, 2014, issue of the *Texas Register*, the Texas Board of Nursing proposed amendments to 22 TAC Chapter 216, §§216.1, 216.5, and 216.6, concerning *Definitions, Additional Criteria for Specific Continuing Education Programs, and Activities that are not Acceptable as Continuing Education*. The amendments are necessary to effectuate the provisions of SB 1058 and SB 1191 enacted during the 83rd Legislative Session. The amendments to the chapter will also allow an individual to receive continuing education credit for authoring an article published in a nursing periodical or developing and presenting a CNE program that would qualify for credit under the Board rules provided it is at least two hours in length. The earliest possible date of adoption is October 19, 2014.

Promoting Patient Safety through the Electronic Health Record and Use of Computerized Provider Order Entry: A Nurse's Duty

In the United States, it is estimated that over 40,000 different medications exist, resulting in hospitals deploying a significant amount of resources on medication management processes (Spaulding & Raghu, 2013). Unintended medication discrepancies, such as prescribing errors, medication administration errors and other adverse drug events occur in one-third of patients, both at the time of admission and during transfer from one unit to another (Hume & Tomsik, 2014). These types of errors may increase the risk of patient harm or actually cause patient harm. The federal Health Information Technology for Economic and Clinical Health Act (HITECH) of 2009 was in part, designed to address these issues, as well as how to share population health information in a secure manner. In order to achieve the goals of the HITECH Act, incentives were provided for Electronic Health Record (EHR) adoption; however, in order to receive the incentives, the adopted EHR must meet meaningful use criteria. One of the core requirements of the meaningful use criteria is Computerized Provider Order Entry (CPOE). CPOE aims to reduce prescribing and other medication administration errors (McGonigle & Mastrian, 2015).

Registered nurses may spend up to 50% of their time administering medications and monitoring patients' responses with a responsibility to promote safety and prevent patient harm [Spaulding & Raghu, 2013; 22 TAC §217.11(1) (B)]. In order to fulfill this duty, nurses must under-

stand why medications are ordered, anticipate possible side effects and know how to correctly administer those medications [22 TAC §217.11(1)(C)]. Because a safe environment for patients is the highest priority for nurses, nursing departments can improve patient safety significantly by promoting CPOE to eliminate incomplete, ambiguous or illegible hand-written medication orders.

Accurate nursing documentation in the EHR and applying clinical reasoning to CPOE order verification should be a daily occurrence for nurses where the EHR has been implemented. Nursing documentation tells a story about the patient and the nursing care rendered. This story informs other nurses and healthcare providers in their subsequent decisions [22 TAC §217.11(1)(D)]. Correctly interpreting provider orders and administering medications combined with accurate and complete documentation of patient needs and responses to care are an essential part of how nurses promote a safe environment for patients.

When nurses encourage healthcare providers to enter a medication order or prescription into the CPOE, rather than accepting an illegible, hand-written order, safety is promoted. An important standard of practice for all nurses to keep in mind when trying to decipher illegible, handwritten medication orders or prescriptions is the need to clarify the accuracy of the order with the ordering healthcare provider [22 TAC§217.11(1)(N)]. In addition, if the orders are not

indicated for the patient, nurses must consult with the ordering healthcare provider and notify the provider if the decision not to administer a medication is made for safety reasons.

Many healthcare providers resist EHR and CPOE technologies due to concerns of usability and a perceived decrease in productivity. To increase engagement, a robust education program that fully orients nurses and healthcare providers to the EHR and CPOE may increase use and productivity. Careful planning with consideration of the setting workflow is critical to achieving increased patient safety (McGonigle & Mastrian, 2015). Board staff recommends that a nurse exercise caution when asked to enter an order electronically into a CPOE or write a verbal order for a healthcare provider who refuses to use the CPOE and is physically present on the unit. These behaviors may be misconstrued as prescribing medications which is not the practice of nursing [Texas Occupations Code 301.002(2) & (5)] and may result in disciplinary action.

Kazemi, Fors, Tofighi, Tessma and Ellenius (2010) found that when providers used CPOE, 80% of medication errors were instantly detected and accurately corrected in the order entry phase before the order was transmitted to nursing. Other advantages have been noted. For example, CPOE is programed to only accept abbreviations that are approved by the Joint Commission and can recognize when providers have

used abbreviations on the “Do Not Use” list. CPOE can also calculate adjustments in medication doses according to a patient’s weight.

Transitioning from a traditional paper order entry process to an EHR with CPOE is challenging. A nurse with expertise in informatics such as an informatics nurse specialist can assist with successful planning and implementation of these technologies (Tietze, 2008). Nurses have an opportunity to promote the correct use of CPOE which may help to reduce more than 17 million errors in U.S. hospitals every year (Formulary, 2013). As nurses move into an age of health care reform, CPOE is a core component of meaningful use in the EHR that ensures safe patient care (Spaulding & Raghu, 2013). Promoting patient safety is the responsibility of all nurses in Texas. E-Notify Service Now Free for Employers



Nursys e-Notify, the national nurse licensure notification system that automatically delivers licensure and publicly available discipline data directly to employers as the data is entered into the Nursys database by U.S. boards of nursing (BONs), is now offered at no cost to employers.

Nursys, which was launched by the National Council of State Boards of Nursing in 2013, is the only national database for verification of nurse licensure, discipline, and practice privileges for registered nurses and licensed practical/vocational nurses. It is comprised of data obtained directly from the licensure systems of U.S. BONs through frequent, secured updates.

If a nurse’s license is about to expire, employers have the option to receive a notification about the expiration date. Employers can also immediately learn about new disciplinary actions issued by a BON for their employed nurse, including receiving access to available public discipline documents. Nursys e-Notify eliminates the need for employers to proactively search for nurse data because they are notified when changes occur.

Online Jurisprudence & Ethics Calculator Available on BON Website

Is a “coach” the same as a preceptor in a nursing education program?



The Board of Nursing (BON or Board) does not define a “coach,” but the term is being applied in different ways in nursing education. For example, the individual could be a tutor or a retention counselor. But when the “coach” is a nurse guiding the clinical experience for a student nurse in a one-on-one mentoring relationship, he/she is serving in a preceptor role.

Rule 214 and Rule 215 define a clinical preceptor as a licensed nurse who is not employed as a faculty member by the nursing program and who directly supervises clinical learning experiences for no more than two (2) students. The preceptor assists in the evaluation of the student(s) during the clinical experiences and in acclimating the student to the role of the nurse. The preceptor also facilitates student learning as outlined in a signed written agreement between the program, the preceptor, and the clinical setting.

Clinical preceptors for registered nurse programs must be registered nurses, but

vocational programs may use licensed vocational nurses as preceptors. Qualifications for preceptors include competence in the designated areas of practice and a philosophy of health care congruent with that of the nursing program.

Clinical preceptors are used to enhance the clinical experiences after a student has received the appropriate instruction for the clinical area. When preceptors are used, the faculty-to-student ratios may be adjusted to allow more students in the clinical group as set out in Education Guideline 3.8.3.a. The preceptor is an extender of the faculty member, but the faculty remains accountable for supervising the student even when a preceptor is being used.

The nursing program is responsible for providing orientation for the preceptors to acquaint them with the clinical objectives for the experience and with the skill level of the students. Faculty are available to the preceptor and student(s)

at all times. Faculty meet regularly with the preceptor and student to monitor the experience.

When the roles and responsibilities of a “coach” are consistent with those of a clinical preceptor, he/she is serving as a preceptor and compliance with the rules related to clinical preceptors must be followed.

In situations where the coach role is NOT equivalent to that of a clinical preceptor, the requirements for the coach position should be consistent with the specific expectations of the role. However, when coaches are providing instruction to students or evaluating their clinical performance, their role may be one of faculty, and Board rules related to faculty qualifications and responsibilities apply.

Did you know....

How to Safely Dispose of Unused and Expired Medications

Teaching patients about how to safely administer their own medications at home is a standard of practice for nurses [22 TAC §217.11 (1) (C) and (F)] and should include information on how to dispose of unused and expired medications properly. Many medications require precautionary steps to dispose of safely so as not to endanger other people, pets, wildlife and the environment. The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has established guidelines on how to dispose of unused medicines at <http://www.fda.gov/forconsumers/consumerupdates/ucm101653.htm>. This is a helpful website and contains information on the importance of proper disposal of drugs and the National Prescription Drug Take-Back Day. When in doubt it is best to consult with a pharmacist on the best way to safely dispose of unused or expired medications.

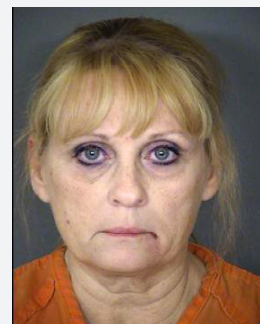

IMPOSTER UPDATE**TONI STRINGFELLOW
a.k.a. Toni C. Stringfellow**

The October 2013 issue of the *Board of Nursing Bulletin* included information regarding Toni Stringfellow, who has an extensive history with the Board regarding her illegal practice as a professional nurse dating back to February 9, 1989. On June 7, 2013, Ms. Stringfellow was arrested while employed as Director of Nursing at a long term care facility in San Antonio. She had used a Texas ID card with the name of a currently licensed RN to gain employment. Toni Stringfellow was indicted for the offenses of Tampering With A Government Record, Fraudulent Use/Possession of Identifying Information (five counts) and Fraudulent Use/Possession of Identifying Information Belonging to Elder (five counts). On September 2, 2014, in the 399th District Court located in Bexar County, Toni Stringfellow was sentenced to thirty (30) years confinement.

**Abbreviations Used in Notice of Disciplinary Action**

PTP Privilege to Practice in Texas, also known as Nurse Licensure Compact Privilege, associated with the indicated state and license. States are abbreviated using the official two letter state abbreviations of the United States Postal System.

Statistical information

The 443 disciplinary actions reported in this bulletin represent only 0.125% of all nurses who are currently licensed to practice in the State of Texas. For the statistical reporting period ending on May 31, 2014, 99.44% of Registered Nurses and 98.74% of Vocational Nurses were without recent discipline according to the Board records.
